SUMMIT WILL ADDRESS PATH FORWARD ON OREGON WILDLAND FIRES AND COMPETING DEMANDS ON FINITE WATER RESOURCES

Regional Oregon economies, quality of life, and human safety and health are increasingly threatened by wildfires. At the same time, tensions are growing over competing demands made on Oregon's finite water resources. Historic practices and policy entanglements impede resolution of both issues. This is complicated further by climate change.

Mainstage and breakout sections of this year's Leadership Summit will address how Oregon can find a way forward through these challenges to natural resources and community well-being.

Matt Donegan, chair of Governor Brown's Wildfire Prevention Council, and fellow council members will highlight the range of risks associated with catastrophic wildfires and smoke, and they'll explore opportunities to protect public health, restore natural systems, and grow local economies by scaling better forest management practices.

Duke Professor Martin Doyle will provide a national perspective on Oregon's water challenges and share solutions pursued elsewhere. This focus is timely as the Governor, Legislature, and stakeholders prepare to rethink Oregon's water policies and investments. This segment will recognize the differences in Oregon's water regions and the ways that innovation and new policies can enhance water resources for long-term environmental, economic, and community benefit.
